The Bible

The Bible is the source of information concerning God and his plan for us and the earth. The Bible was written by Godly men and women, eg Moses, the prophets and apostles, under the guidance of God via his spirit. The Bible is therefore God's word and is a true record, with the exception of translation and copying errors. The Bible is the Christian's "handbook" which details all aspects of Christian living. Together with prayer the Bible is an essential part of Christian life.

God

There is only one God. He has always existed and always will, and is in heaven. The God we worship now is the same God who was worshipped by, and appeared to, Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and Moses. God showed his character in his Son, Jesus. God is Jesus' father and is in control of the universe, which he created by his spirit, his power. Because of God's power, love and greatness he deserves to be worshipped and praised.

Jesus' birth

Jesus is God's Son. Jesus' mother is Mary, who became pregnant, via God's power, when still a virgin. Jesus was given the holy spirit (power) by God, at the time of his baptism.

Luke 1:26-35	Mary told that she would give birth to Jesus, and that God would be his father. Jesus was to become King.
Gal 4:4	God knew it was the right time in the history of the world so he caused Jesus to be born with human nature so he could save
ls 7:14	Jesus' actual birth was prophesied and what his mother would be, also that he would be called "God with us"
Matt 3:16-17	God gives his power, his holy spirit, to Jesus at Jesus' baptism
ls 11:2	Prophecy that Jesus would have God's power, understanding and wisdom
ls 42:1	Jesus was God's servant and, with God's power, would bring justice to the world
ls 61:1	God's power enabled Jesus to preach, help, heal and save those people who would believe in him

Jesus to Save

Because of man's natural sinfulness, right from the time of Adam, it was necessary for God to provide Jesus to give his life for us.

Rom 5:12-19	Adam, and man, break God's commands, therefore we die, but
	Jesus obeyed, therefore there is an opportunity of life

2 Cor 5:19-21	God detests sin, but in his love he provided Jesus so that man can
	be changed before God if we believe

Adam

Adam was the first human being. He was created by God from the dust of the ground and was considered by God to be "Very good". Adam, and every human since, has been kept alive by God's power through the air that we breathe. Adam's life was conditional in that he had to obey the commandment given by God. Failure to do so would result in Adam's death.

Gen 2:7	Adam was created from the dust and God breathed air into his nose to make him live
Gen 18:27	Abraham accepted that he was dust and ashes
Job 4:19	Eliphaz accepts that man comes from the dust of the ground
Job 33:6	Elihu accepts that man is just dust
1 Cor 15:46-49	A spiritual comparison between Adam and Jesus. Unless we
	accept Jesus we will also die like Adam
Gen 2:17	Adam given one command by God. If he broke that command God would cease to prevent him from dying

Sin

Adam broke the law that God had given and God carried out the sentence of death for not obeying. Adam died and returned to the ground. Adam was characteristic of all human beings and the sentence of death is now the natural conclusion of all human life.

Gen 3:15-19	Adam broke God's law. Therefore the sentence of death was
	passed upon him in that he would return to the ground
Gen 3:22-23	Adam was driven out of the garden of Eden
2 Cor 1:9	The sentence of death is on all men. God wants us therefore to

Rom 7:24	Paul knew that man dies and knew that there is no escape
2 Cor 5:2-4	Man's life is temporary and will end up in death, unless Jesus is accepted

God's Love

God, in his love, provided a way out of death, for those who love him, without detracting from his sentence of death for man's sins. The natural conclusion for man's disobedience of God is total destruction, but God planned that that should not be the case and that the earth will be populated with those who love and willingly obey him. In his love, God provided Jesus to take away sin and die once for all those who follow him.

Rev 21:4	God has promised a time when there will be no more death, therefore no more sin
John 3:16	God's love for his creation, and us, was such that he allowed Jesus to die so that our nature can be changed
2 Tim 1:10	Jesus' death, allowed by God's love for us, meant that death was destroyed and there can be life for those who follow Jesus
1 John 2:25	God has promised those who believe that they will live for ever
2 Tim 1:1	The natural outcome of human life is death, this can be changed through Jesus
Titus 1:2	A better quality of life is offered those who believe in and obey Jesus
Rom 3:26	Our nature is changed through the death of Jesus and our faith in God in that our sins are forgiven
John 1:29	Jesus takes away the natural course of events that comes to man, ie death

Promises

God told Adam, Abraham, David and the prophets of his plan for the human population of the earth that there would be an opportunity for believers to overcome sin and death

Gen 3:15	Serpent's descendants = sin, Eve's descendants = Jesus. Sin, ie death, will be overcome by Jesus
Gen 22:18	People of the world would be blessed through one of Abraham's descendants, ie Jesus
Ps 89:34-37	God promised that David's royal descendants would go on for ever
Hosea 13:14	God promised that he would remove death from his people, ie all those who follow him
ls 25:7-9	God says that he will destroy death in that he will save those who trust and believe in him
ls 51:1-8	God's righteousness will last for ever and he will save and allow into his kingdom all those who trust him
Jer 23:5	God promised that a just and righteous ruler, descended from David, will rule from Israel, ie Jesus

Jesus, the Saviour

The promises that God gave to Adam, Abraham, David and the prophets referred to Jesus, who was a descendant of David and therefore was human like every other person. Because of Jesus' human nature he was condemned to die like everyone else, but because he didn't sin and that he always obeyed God, he didn't deserve to die. Jesus overcame his natural tendency for man to sin and God therefore raised him from the dead because he had overcome sin for himself and for all those who believe in him.

1 Cor 15:45	Difference between Adam (man, sinful) and Jesus (life, sinless)
Heb 2:14-16	Jesus was able to destroy death because of his ability to sin,
	believers were "slaves to death" before they accepted Jesus
Rom 1:3	Jesus was a descendant from David, therefore human and had the ability to sin
Heb 5:8-9	Though Jesus was human he didn't sin, he obeyed God, therefore is able to save all who believe him
Heb 1:8-9	Jesus obeyed God, because he wanted to, he will therefore rule justly for ever
Rom 5:19-21	Adam sinned, therefore we die. Jesus didn't, therefore we can be saved. Laws existed to expose sin
Gal 4:4-5	God sent Jesus, who had human nature, so that all those who have faith will also be saved
Rom 8:3-4	Believers are free from death because Jesus overcame the law, which couldn't save, and sin
Heb 2:15	Everyone dies, but Jesus can save us from death
Heb 9:26	By his sacrifice, Jesus got rid of sin and death
Gal 1:4	Jesus, voluntarily, allowed himself to be crucified, so that believers could be saved from their sins
Heb 7:27	Unlike the priests, who sacrificed every day, Jesus was sacrificed once for all believers
Heb 2:17	Because Jesus was human he is able to understand our sins and change the way that God looks at us

Rom 6:9-10	Jesus didn't sin so he was raised from the dead, therefore he can't die again, his death saves believers
Acts 13:34-37 Rev 1:18 John 5:21-22	Jesus' body was not to decay in the grave Jesus confirming that he had been raised from the dead Jesus has the power, from God, to save believers from the results of sin - death
John 5:26-27	Jesus has the authority, from God, to judge. Jesus does what his father would do
Rev 2:7	Jesus will save all believers from death
Rev 3:21	Jesus will allow all true believers to rule with him, on the earth, for ever
Matt 25:21	Jesus' parable of talents, indicating that just believers will rule with Jesus
Heb 5:9	Jesus is the source of a perfect quality of life because he is sinless
Mark 16:16	For Jesus to save, the believer must be baptised, otherwise the person can't be saved from sin and death
Acts 13:38-39	Because of Jesus' death, believers can have forgiveness of sins and be exempt from God's law of death
Rom 3:22	The only way to be saved from God's punishment is to have faith in Jesus, and obey his commands
Ps 2:6-9	Jesus will rule over the whole world from Jerusalem
Dan 7:13-14	Prophecy stating that Jesus will rule the world with total authority. His kingdom will not be destroyed
Rev 11:15	Jesus will rule over the earth for ever
Jer 23:5 Zech 14:9	A descendant of David, Jesus, will rule wisely over God's Kingdom Jesus will rule over the whole earth
Eph 1:9-10	When the time is right, Jesus will be the ruler of the whole world

Jesus' life

For Jesus to have been able to overcome sin for himself and believers, it was necessary for him to be born with human nature. Human nature meant that Jesus was condemned to death just the same as everyone who has ever lived, but he overcame all temptations and was therefore a "perfect sacrifice", such perfection was required by God for the forgiveness of our sins. Because Jesus didn't sin God raised him from the dead and through belief in Jesus we are saved.

Matt 1:18-25	Jesus' mother was Mary. Jesus was born to save his people and one of his names meant "God with us".
Luke 1:26-35	Mary, a virgin, was told by God that Jesus would rule over God's Kingdom for ever
Gal 4:4	When the time was right, God caused Jesus to be born with human nature, ie subject to sin and death
ls 7:14	Jesus' birth prophesied that a virgin would give birth to a son who was to be called Immanuel "God with us"
Rom 1:3-4	Jesus, a descendant of David, possessed human nature. His resurrection confirmed that he was God's son
Rom 8:3	God requires that a perfect sacrifice be made for sin, Jesus didn't sin, therefore he was a perfect sacrifice
2 Cor 5:21	Because Jesus didn't sin be overcame human nature, therefore we can also be called "sons of God" if we believe in and follow Jesus
Heb 2:14-17	Jesus was human so that he could understand our temptations and change our position before God

Jesus' teachings

Jesus taught God's words to the Jews at his time. He preached that everyone who heard should acknowledge their sins and ask for forgiveness, that he was God's son and would be the future King of the Jews and that God would restore his Kingdom, on earth, through him. Jesus' teachings weren't new, many of his teachings where expanding the teachings of the prophets in Old Testament times, all teachings were God's.

Mark 1:15	Jesus preached the Kingdom of God. He said it was near and that people should repent.
Matt 4:17	Jesus preached repentance because God's Kingdom was soon to come
Matt 5:20-48	Jesus' teachings went further than the laws of Moses, they included Christian living and thoughts
John 10:36	Jesus said he was God's son
John 9:35	Jesus was the son of man - he had a human mother
John 11:27	Jesus was the Saviour, God's son, that was promised by God
John 19:21	Jesus was also the King of the Jews, God's people
John 1:49	Jesus the son of God, and the King of Israel, God's land
Matt 27:11-42	At his trial Jesus confirmed that he was God's son. Pilate accepted that Jesus was the King of the Jews
John 10:24-25	Jesus' miracles confirmed that Jesus was the Christ and God's Son
Matt 19:28	Jesus promised his 12 disciples that they would judge the tribes of Israel when he becomes King
Matt 21:42-43	Jesus warns that the Kingdom of God will be taken away from the Jews and given to others (Ps 118:22)
Matt 23:38-39	The Jews must accept that Jesus is God's son before being accepted into God's kingdom when Jesus returns to the earth
Matt 25:14-46	Parables of the talents and the sheep and goats. Best efforts are required before being accepted into Kingdom
Luke 4:43	Jesus' main object was to preach the "kingdom of God"
Luke 13:27-30	Jesus warns that some people will be removed from God's Kingdom
Luke 19:11-27	Jesus' parable of talents. Best efforts are required to be saved and enter God's kingdom
Luke 22:28-30	Jesus tells his disciples that they would judge the 12 tribes of Israel when he becomes King
Matt 5:17	Jesus was not sent by his father to abolish Moses' I aw but to fulfil it
Luke 24:44	Jesus' existence and teachings were prophesied in the law, prophets and Psalms

Jesus' death

Jesus' teachings were not accepted by the Jews nor did they accept him as God's son, he was incorrectly accused of blasphemy by them, and was crucified by the Jews and the Romans. However, the Jews' actions were foreseen by God in that Jesus would be a "perfect sacrifice" so that sin and death, the result of sin, could be done away with. Jesus was sacrificed once for the sins of human nature so that man's natural position before God was changed, and all those who accept Jesus are forgiven.

Luke 19:47	The Jewish religious authorities looked for ways to kill Jesus
Luke 20:1-16	The Jewish leaders wanted to arrest Jesus but they were afraid of the people
John 11:45-53	Afraid of the Romans taking away their power, the Jewish leaders wanted Jesus dead
Acts 10:38-39	Even though Jesus was seen to have miraculous powers, the Jews still killed him in their jealousy
Acts 13:26-29	Prophecy was fulfilled when Jesus was killed, but as a result everyone has the opportunity of being saved
Acts 4:27-28	The Jews were so desperate to have Jesus killed that they conspired with the Roman authorities, who were normally hated
Rom 8:3	The law was powerless to save, so God sent Jesus with human nature, to be a perfect sacrifice
Heb 10:10	Because of Jesus' sacrifice, once for everyone, believers have been made holy and have been saved
Rom 3:25	Jesus was given by God, as a sacrifice so that God's condemnation of human nature could be changed
Acts 13:38	It is through Jesus that believers can have forgiveness of their sins
1 John 1:7	Jesus' sacrifice gives believers forgiveness of sins if they always attempt to follow Jesus' commands
John 14:6	There is only one way to go to God and have forgiveness, and that is through Jesus' death
Acts 4:12	Through Jesus' death and resurrection, is the only way to be saved
1 Pet 3:18	Jesus died, once, for the world's sins so that believers can have forgiveness and be saved
1 Pet 2:24	Jesus died on the cross for the world's sins, believers therefore have been saved
Heb 9:14	Even though sin leads to death, Jesus' sacrifice allows believers to have forgiveness of their sins
Heb 7:27	Jesus' sacrifice was only required once, and that was for the sins of the world
Heb 9:26-28	Jesus died once to save himself and the world, if they believe
Gal 1:4	It was God's plan that Jesus was sacrificed so that believers could be saved
Rom 15:8	The Gentiles were given an opportunity when the Jews rejected Jesus, this confirmed the prophets' words
Gal 3:21-22	The original law could not save, only Jesus could, therefore what the law promised is given to believers
Gal 2:21	The law could not save believers from sin, and ultimately death
Gal 4:4-5	Jesus was sent, by God, to the human race to save them from sin and to make believers sons of God
Heb 9:15	Jesus' sacrifice saves believers from the effects of sin and through his death, they are brought to a Godly life
Luke 22:20	The wine at the Last Supper represents Jesus' blood that was poured out for the sins of the world
Luke 24:26	It was in God's plan that Jesus was to be sacrificed
Luke 24:46-47	It was prophesied that Jesus would be sacrificed and then be raised so that believers could be forgiven
Matt 26:28	The wine represented Jesus' blood which was poured out for the sins of the world if only they believed

Jesus' resurrection

God raised Jesus on the third day after he was crucified because Jesus overcame the temptations that are experienced by human nature and he didn't sin. Jesus'

resurrection meant that he had overcome the power of sin and death so that all believers can have life just as he has.

1 Cor 15:4	Just as the prophets predicted, Jesus was raised by God from the dead on the third day
Acts 10:40	God raised Jesus from the dead on the third day and this miracle was witnessed by many believers
Acts 13:30-37	Jesus' resurrection was witnessed by the disciples and by fulfilment of prophecy. (Ps 2:7, 16:10, Is 55:3)
Acts 2:24-27	Jesus didn't sin so the punishment of death was not relevant, therefore he was raised (Ps 16:8-11)

Jesus - mediator between God and believers

Jesus, now in heaven, he became the mediator between God and believers, enabling believers to have forgiveness when they sin and request God's forgiveness.

Luke 24:51	Jesus was taken up into heaven, the disciples were told that he would return in the same way
Eph 1:20	After God had raised Jesus from the dead he also brought him to heaven to sit at God's right hand
Acts 5:31	God brought Jesus to heaven to sit at his right hand so that forgiveness of believers could be made
1 Tim 2:5	Jesus is the mediator between God and men
Heb 8:1	Jesus is now at God's right hand in heaven
Acts 15:14	The implication is that there is a distinction between believers and non believers
Acts 13:39	It is only through belief in Jesus that people can be saved
Heb 4:14-15	Jesus, now in heaven, is able to sympathise with believers' sins
John 17:9	A distinction exists between the believers and non believers, a belief in Jesus is necessary to be saved
Heb 10:26 1 John 2:1 Prov 28:13	A believer has a duty to attempt to refrain from sinning When believers sin, Jesus speaks to God in their defense In order to have forgiveness there must first be a confession of sins

Repentance and forgiveness

The apostles preached to the Jews and the Gentiles that they needed to be saved from sin and death and that the only way to be saved was through a belief in Jesus. The duty for believers to preach is the same as it was for the first disciples.

Acts 1:8	Jesus instructs his disciples that the message of Jesus should be preached to everyone
Matt 28:19-20	Believers are instructed to preach to everyone and to baptise those who believe that they too are saved
Luke 24:46-48	The need for repentance and the forgiveness of sins must be preached to everyone
Acts 26:16-18	The need to preach was so that others (Jews and Gentiles) can receive forgiveness of sins if they believe
Acts 4:12	It is only by a belief in Jesus that anyone is saved

Belief and baptism

The only way to have forgiveness and to be saved is to believe the teachings of Jesus and be associated with his death by being baptised. The believer is expected to attempt to follow Jesus' commands to maintain Jesus' friendship.

Acts 13:48	The Gentiles believed what they were taught
Acts 16:31	The jailer believed. He knew that if he did he would be saved
Mark 16:16	To be saved a person must believe and be baptised otherwise he will remain condemned to death
Rom 1:16	The teachings of Jesus are the power of God which ensures that people who believe are saved
Acts 2:38	The only way to be forgiven and be saved is to repent of one's sins and be baptised
Acts 2:41	In order to save one's self from death one has to accept Jesus' message and be baptised
Acts 10:47	Cornelius and his family and friends believed and were baptised so that they could be saved
Acts 8:12	People responded to Philip's teachings by believing and being baptised
Gal 3:27-29	By being baptised believers associate with Jesus and are therefore heirs, with him, to God's Kingdom
Rom 6:3-5	Being baptised means that believers associate with Jesus' death and resurrection, therefore are raised
Rom 2:7	God will give a better quality of life to those believers who do good because they want to seek God
Matt 28:20	Baptism is the start, from then on the believer must attempt to obey Jesus' commands
John 15:14	Believers are Jesus' friends only if they follow his commands

Jesus' teaching

The Gospel (Good News) is centred on Jesus' teachings, which were repeated by the apostles, about the "Kingdom of God", and about how to be saved through Jesus.

Acts 8:12	Men and women were baptised after Philip had told them of God's
	kingdom and about Jesus
Acts 19:8	Paul taught about God's kingdom
Acts 19:10	Paul's teachings consisted of Jesus' teachings of repentance and about God's kingdom
Acts 19:20 Acts 28:30-31	Jesus' teachings were told to many people by the apostles Paul taught about Jesus and God's Kingdom

God's Kingdom

Aspects of God's kingdom are explained to believers in the Bible.

God's Kingdom on earth

God's Kingdom will be set up on earth, it will be the only kingdom and it will include the whole earth, therefore all existing nations and kingdoms will be overthrown by God. Jesus will rule perfectly and justly and there will eventually be no more violence in the earth.

Dan 2:44	God will set up a Kingdom which will never be destroyed, it will overpower all other kingdoms
Dan 7:13-14	Jesus will have a kingdom on earth, that will last for ever, he will rule over all the earth
Rev 11:15	The earth will become Jesus' kingdom and he will rule over it for ever
ls 32:1	Jesus will reign over the earth justly, he will be a perfect ruler for everyone

Jesus' return to earth

When God considers the time is right, when man has done enough damage to himself and the earth has become so ungodly, he will send Jesus back to the earth. On his return, Jesus will pass judgement on everyone for their actions.

Acts 3:20-21	Jesus will return, when God considers it appropriate, he will restore
	the earth as it was at creation
Ps 102:16	God's land will be rebuilt
Ps 102:21	God will be worshipped at Jerusalem
2 Tim 4:1	Jesus will pass judgement on all those who are living and on those who are dead
Acts 1:9	Jesus' disciples saw Jesus being taken up to heaven by God
Acts 1:11	The disciples were told, by the angels, that Jesus would return to earth in the same way as he went
Dan 7:13	Daniel's prophecy that Jesus would return to the earth

Israel

The land of Israel was promised to Abraham and to Jesus, by God, and it would be theirs for ever. The land of Israel was given to God's chosen people as their land and their return to it will be a fulfilment of one of God's promises.

Amos 9:11	Israel will be restored, by God, as a prosperous nation to how it was at the time of David
Amos 9:15	When God restores Israel to their land they will never be made to go into exile again
Ezek 37:21-22	The Jews will return to Israel, to form one nation ruled by one person
Jer 23:3	The Jews will return to their own land from all the nations where they were exiled
Gen 13:14-17	God promised Abraham, and his descendants, all the land he could see, Israel
Heb 11:8-9	Abraham's faith. He was promised the land he walked through, ie Israel
Gal 3:16	The land (Israel) was promised to Jesus as well as to Abraham
Lev 26:42	God promised Abraham, Isaac and Jacob that he would remember the promises of Jesus and Israel
Micah 7:20	God will remember the promises that he made to Abraham

Jerusalem - God's capital city

God had promised that the Jews, formally his people, would return to Israel from all over the world where they had been in exile since the time of Israel. This process has started. God had prophesied that the Jews and the land of Israel would be under the control of other nations for a very long time, until Jerusalem would be rebuilt. Ultimately Jerusalem will be the capital of the world from where Jesus will rule and only God's people will be living in Jerusalem

ls 11:12 Jer 31:10	The Jews will return from exile from all over the world God promised that he will bring the Jews back to Israel and that he would look after them
Zech 8:8	God's promises that his people will return to live in Jerusalem
Ezek 36:34	The land of Israel will be cultivated again and be fertile
ls 51:3	God will allow Israel to be cultivated again and the deserts will produce crops
ls 60:15	The land of Israel will be a source of pride and joy for the people of the world
ls 62:4	Israel will be known as God's land and the people who live there as God's people
Jer 3:17	God's throne will be in Jerusalem where everyone will gather to worship God
Micah 4:6-8	The capital of God's kingdom will be Jerusalem, all of God's people will be made into a strong nation
Joel 3:17	Jerusalem will be God's throne and only those people who worship God will live there
ls 24:23	Jerusalem will be a holy city where God will live

The resurrection

When Jesus returns from heaven all of those people who have followed Jesus and have remained faithful will be raised, if they are dead when Jesus returns, and together with those who are still alive will be with Jesus for ever. When Jesus returns there will be a judgement made on those who are God's people and those who aren't.

Dan 12:2	The resurrection and judgement passed by God on the good and the bad
Luke 13:28	Abraham, Isaac, Jacob and the prophets will be in God's Kingdom
Rev 11:18	At God's judgement, God's people will be rewarded but those who destroy the earth will be destroyed
1 Thess 4:15-17	Jesus will return, dead Godly people will be raised and with Godly people still alive will be with him
John 5:28-29	Godly people who are dead will be raised to life, those who aren't Godly will be raised to be condemned
John 6:39-40	All Jesus' followers would be saved, those who are dead he will raise, all faithful will be given eternal life
Luke 14:14	All those who do good now will be rewarded when Jesus returns
Matt 24:35-46	Don't know when Jesus will return, therefore all Jesus' followers must live a Godly life now

Judgement

When Jesus returns there will be a judgement on all those people who are alive at his return and on all those who have been raised. The followers of Jesus will be given eternal life whilst those who have neglected Jesus and not followed him will be condemned to death again.

2 Cor 5:10	There will be a judgement on all followers of Jesus
2 Tim 4:1	When Jesus returns he will judge those who are alive and those who have been raised from the dead
Rom 2:5-11	There will be judgement for the good and the bad. The good will be given life, the bad will suffer God's anger

Rom 14:10-11	Everyone will be judged by God
1 Cor 4:5	Jesus' followers' actions will be judged when he returns, they will be rewarded according to their actions
Rev 11:18	When Jesus returns all will be judged and rewarded for their actions

Immortality

The people who have been judged by Jesus as being unfaithful will be sentenced to death, whereas those who have been faithful will be given life. Those who are given life will reign with Jesus over God's Kingdom which will be set up on earth for ever. The life the saints will live will be of a much better quality than now, praising and worshipping God.

Matt 7:26	To be judged faithful a person has to put into practice what Jesus teaches
Matt 8:12	Not everyone will be allowed into God's Kingdom, some will be thrown out
Matt 25:20	Different people have different abilities but they have to be used to the best advantage to please God
Dan 12:2	There is a difference between God's followers and those who aren't
Gal 6:8	The way people's lives are led now dictates their standing before God, we either please God or ourselves
Gal 5:21	Once a person is baptised they have to live a Christian life otherwise they will not enter God's kingdom
2 Thess 1:8	Those who do not know Jesus' teachings and do not obey him will be punished
Heb 10:26-28	Once baptised, the Christian has an obligation to stop deliberately sinning
2 Pet 2:12	Ungodly people are no better than animals in that they die
Rev 21:8	Evil people will die
Mal 4:1	The day will come when there will be no more ungodly and evil people
Ps 37:30-38	Godly people will be saved, ungodly people will be destroyed
Prov 10:25-29	Those who fear God will have life, those who neglect God will die
1 Cor 15:51-55	When Jesus returns the faithful will be changed to immortality and will not die
2 Cor 5:1-4	The believer has the confidence that they will be changed when Jesus returns
James 1:12	The believer knows that if they remain faithful they will receive life in God's Kingdom
Rom 2:7	If believers persist in doing good and seek God they will be given life

John 10:28 Matt 5:5 Ps 37:9, 22, 29	Jesus gives us eternal life The meek will inherit the earth Evil people will be destroyed and the people who hope in God will inherit the kingdom and live for ever
Rev 5:9	By his death, Jesus has saved people from every nation in the world - if they believe and are baptised
Dan 7:27	The rulers of God's kingdom will be God's people, the saints, who will rule for ever and worship God
1 Thess 2:12	God is calling those who believe to his kingdom therefore we should live worthy lives

The Kingdom of God during Jesus' rule

God's kingdom will last for a period of time during which those who haven't accepted Jesus will live mortal lives. Those who had accepted Jesus before he returned, will reign with him.

Rev 20:4-8 Those who are raised when Jesus returns will be made immortal and will reign with Jesus
1 Cor 15:24-28 After this period of time, when death has been finally destroyed, Jesus will hand the kingdom to God

God's ways taught to everyone

God's laws will be taught, by Jesus and the saints, to the people of the world who have not yet accepted Jesus. The result of this teaching is that eventually war will be a thing of the past and everyone who lives will want to serve God. Jesus will rule and settle arguments fairly.

Micah 4:2	People of the earth will want to go to Jerusalem to learn of God's laws and ways
ls 42:4	Jesus will, eventually, bring justice to everyone and everything on earth
ls 11:1-5	Jesus will be a just ruler who knows everyone's motives and acts accordingly
ls 2:4	Jesus will be a just ruler, arguments amongst people will be settled fairly and not by war
Hab 2:14	Everyone will know of God's laws and ways and will want to learn and worship God as he wants

Jesus' actions during his reign

Jesus' main objective is to subdue all of his, and God's enemies which ultimately include death, meaning that no one will break any of God's laws. The people who have not accepted Jesus at his return will have an opportunity to repent and accept Jesus, demonstrating God's love that he is prepared to allow Jesus a long time to teach.

Jesus will rule over God's kingdom until sin and death have been
destroyed
A time will come when there will be no more sadness and death in
the world
God will eventually ensure that there will be no more death or sadness in the earth

God's Kingdom

At the end of Jesus' rule, when there is no more sin and death in the world and all those who are alive will want to worship and praise God, Jesus will hand the Kingdom to God.

1 Cor 15:24	Jesus will hand the Kingdom to his father once he has destroyed all
	things that are opposing to God

God's rule

When God takes over from Jesus everyone will want to worship and be friends of God. God will be everywhere he will be seen in everything and there will be peace and perfection in the world - as God intended in the first place when he created the world. This situation is something that we cannot relate to but we do know that it will be perfect.

1 Cor 15:28 God will be "all in all".
